The course, inter alia, will cover transport connectivity across different modes of transport with emphasis on rail connectivity, digital connectivity by laying optic-fibres along railway tracks and roads, development of dry ports, facilitation measures for movement of goods and people across borders and harmonization of technical, operational, regulatory systems and practices relevant to cross-border transit.</p> <p><b>Objectives:</b> 1) The Forum will highlight the role of information and communication technology (ICT) networks and services in disaster risk reduction and management, and saving lives. Discussions will also revolve around how the use of telecommunication/ICT for disaster risk reduction contributes to the achievement of internationally agreed targets, including those of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction. 2)Sessions will focus on disaster risk reduction strategies, national emergency telecommunication planning and policies, resilient infrastructure, and national coordination. The event will also highlight the importance of early-warning and monitoring systems, the introduction and use of emerging technologies and innovations, and the application of big data to predict and address emergency situations.
